The Davis-Bacon Act directs the Department of Labor to determine such locally prevailing wage rates. The Davis-Bacon Act applies to contractors and subcontractors performing work on federal or District of Columbia contracts. The Davis-Bacon Act prevailing wage provisions apply to the " Related Acts, " under which federal agencies assist construction projects through grants, loans, loan guarantees, and insurance.

The Davis-Bacon Act requires contractors and subcontractors working on federally funded jobs to pay their laborers wages and benefits no less than what others locally pay their workers for similar projects. This is called the " prevailing " wage. Under Davis-Bacon, contractors can pay this wage out as a combination of cash and fringe benefits.

Enacted in 1931, the Davis Bacon Act requires the payment of prevailing wages on any federally funded or assisted project involving the construction, repair and/or alteration of a public building in excess of \$2,000. The specific requirements of the Davis-Bacon Act are as follows:

The Davis-Bacon Act and Prevailing Wages

The Davis-Bacon Act directs the Secretary of Labor to determine such local prevailing wage rates. In addition to the Davis-Bacon Act itself, Congress has added prevailing wage provisions to approximately 60 statutes which assist construction projects through grants, loans, loan guarantees, and insurance. These "related Acts" involve construction in such areas as transportation, housing, air and water pollution reduction, and health.

What are the Davis-Bacon and Related Acts? - Wage and Hour ...

Pieces of legislation like the Davis-Bacon Act ensure that contractors who bid on public construction projects will pay prevailing wages to their employees. This ensures their pay is sufficient for family support. The laws also safeguard that federally- and state-funded projects are built to high standards.

The Davis-Bacon Act as amended, requires that each contract over \$2000 to which the United States or the District of Columbia is a party for the construction, alteration, or repair of public buildings or public works shall contain a clause setting forth the minimum wages to be paid to various classes of laborers and mechanics employed under the contract.

Davis Bacon Wage Rate Determination A wage determination is the listing of wage rates and fringe benefit rates for each classification of mechanics and laborers for which the Department of Labor has determined to be prevailing in a given area for a particular type of construction.

Contracts on state projects which require the p ayment of prevailing wages pursuant to the federal Davis-Bacon Act or related acts (see appendix B of 29 CFR Part I) or con tracts that contain wage or fringe benefits rates that are equal or greater than the prevailing rate are not subject to the Act.

Thirty-one states have also enacted state prevailing wage legislation (commonly referred to as " Little Davis-Bacon " provisions). These laws require prevailing wage and fringe benefit payments on state and federal projects. Not only do these laws protect contractors, but they also save them money on payroll.
